





HOW TO GET TO MAINZ & CAMPUS





TRAVELING FROM THE AIRPORT TO MAINZ CENTRAL STATION

There are two airports close to Mainz:

1. FRANKFURT INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (30 MIN. AWAY)

From there you can take the train or S-Bahn to Mainz central station.

Trains from Frankfurt / Flughafen Regionalbahnhof to Mainz: S-Bahn S8, Regional Railway (RB) and the Regional Express (RE); Tickets cost around 6-7€. Travel time about 30 minutes.

2. FRANKFURT HAHN AIRPORT (90 MIN. AWAY)

From here you travel can by bus to Mainz central station The "Flibco" bus leaves for Mainz from Terminal 3 everv three hours. Tickets cost around EUR 17€ Travel time about 80 minutes.

TRAVELING FROM MAINZ CENTRAL STATION TO THE CAMPUS

Plenty of buses and tram lines go from the central station to the campus.

There are several different stops due to the large scale of the university campus.

We would recommend using tram lines 51, 53, 59 or the number 57 bus, because they stop directly at the main entrance of the campus. www.uni-mainz.de/eng/118.php

Use your semester ticket!

From April 1st onwards you can use your semester ticket for your journey from Frankfurt and within Mainz (regional transport)

RIDE A BIKE IN MAINZ

"GREEN MOBILITY "

Sustainability and climate protection are two of our time's central topics and everyone can contribute. JGU Mainz is glad about every exchange student who (if possible) chooses to travel to the university using **climate friendly modes of transport** (train or bus instead of airplane or car).

Mainz is easily reached with a train from most European cities via Frankfurt am Main.

Information for Erasmus+ students: The Erasmus+ program is also pursuing the goal of becoming more sustainable – ask your home university if you can receive the special "green mobility" grant for your trip. STUDIERENDENWERK MAINZ DORMITORIES

If you applied for a room in the dormitories within the application deadline, you should already have had contact with the Studierendenwerk Mainz by now (wohnen@studierendenwerkmainz.de) or you may have already received a confirmation for a room.

Here you will find an overview of all the dormitories of the Studierendenwerk Mainz (Stw Mainz). To find out how to get there, simply click on your dormitory and you will be provided with directions. www.studierendenwerkmainz.de/en/wohnen/dormitories

ROOM EQUIPMENT: BASIC PACK

Every room is equipped with furniture (wardrobe, bed, chair, table and desk chair). Please keep in mind that the following is NOT provided:

> Bedding (blanket, pillow, bedcovers) & towels Dishes, cooking pots & cutlery

If you can't or don't want to transport these items, you can order a basic package that includes the listed items for 75 euros. More information: www.studierendenwerkmainz.de/en/internationales/housinginternational/basic-room-equipment

RENT

Transfer the rent and the deposit to the Studierendenwerk Mainz **before the contract period** begins. Information on payment and the account information is in the email "Mietvertrag angekommen" from the Studierendenwerk.

Once you have returned the contract digitally to wohnen@studierendenwerk-mainz.de, send the original contract with your original signature (pen on paper (3)) to the following address within the next 10 days:

If you do **not** live in Europe, take the original contract with you and either drop it in the letterbox at the Info point (Studierendenwerk Mainz, Abteilung Studentisches Wohnen, Staudingerweg 21, 55128 Mainz), hand it in there, or send it via regular mail once you arrive at JGU.

DEPOSIT

When moving in, you are required to pay a one-time deposit ("Kaution" = the sum of two month's rent), which will be returned to you when you move out, providing that you have left your room in good condition. Report any damages present when you move in to your dormitory's facility manager office and have them entered in the log.

ACCOMMODATION

MOVING-IN

Head directly to your dormitory on moving-in day. The **facility manager** will give you the keys to your room.

The earliest day for moving in during the summer semester 2024 is **April 2nd**, as April 1st falls on a Holiday (Easter Monday).

If you arrive on April 2nd, you can comfortably participate in the starting of the Welcome Week on April 3rd. The Studierendenwerk will send you further information on the moving-in process via email shortly before you move in.

You can only move in during the opening hours of the respective caretaker ("**Hausmeister**") of the dormitory. You can find the office hours here: www.studierendenwerkmainz.de/en/wohnen/moving-





Please note:

- The total number of courses should not exceed **30 ECTS** each semester.
- ✓ Your major (the subject in which you are enrolled at JGU, compare to your letter of admission) should account for 15 ECTS minimum. If you have to achieve more than 15 ECTS, the remaining credits can alsobe chosen from different subjects.
- ✓ Erasmus+ students: Please try to stick to your Learning Agreement as much as possible. Please make sure that you enter the correct Erasmus+ departmental coordinator. Please note the information in the Practical Guide Part 1 ("7 steps to JGU").





STEP 2: PERSONAL CONSULTATION WITH YOUR ACADEMIC ADVISOR

- a) Check the list of academic advisors (see links on previous page). Choose the relevant person(s) and contact them by email or during their office hours. https://www.international-office.uni-mainz.de/academic-advisors_exchange/
- b) They will advise you and officially confirm your choice. Afterwards, they will forward the form to the Studienbüro (office for the registration of courses).
- c) Repeat the process once for every subject in which you would like to attend classes.





REGISTRATION FOR EXAMINATION



There is **no general rule for exam registrations** (except for students of Law & Economics see page 24).

In each course, you have to ask your teacher which regulations apply to you. Usually, exams are taken at the end of the lecture period or shortly after.



Please consider this when planning your departure and consult with your department! There is no general deadline for the exam registration. Please check with your department

Grade distribution:

You will receive grades between 1.0 and 5.0. You will pass the examination if your grade is between 1.0 (very good) and 4.0 (sufficient). You fail if you get a 5.0 (not sufficient).

Exeption Law: Points between 0 and 18 (You pass with 4 points)

Credit Points (CP)/ ECTS:

The workload of 1 CP is up to 30 hours. They are based on the ECTS (European Credit Transfer System).

TYPES OF EXAMS

There are usually four different types of exams depending on the classes you take:

WRITTEN EXAM ("KLAUSUR")

Usually written at the end of the semester in one of the last sessions or shortly after the end of the lecture period.

ORAL EXAM ("MÜNDLICHE PRÜFUNG")


An examination in the form of a discussion between you and your examiner, on a certain academic subject.

WRITTEN TERM PAPER ("SCHRIFTLICHE HAUSARBEIT")

After consulting with your teacher, you choose a topic connected to your class to write a term paper on.

PRESENTATION ("REFERAT")

The teacher assigns a topic that is relevant to the course. You have to prepare an oral report, either alone or in a group. Presentations are usually held during the semester in one of the class sessions.






HOW TO ACTIVATE YOUR STUDENT ACCOUNT



Once you are enrolled, you will receive your log-in data for your student account. Your username and password enable you to log into any computer on campus, to use your own student email account as well as the printers and photocopiers all across campus and to log in to JOGU-StINe. You will also have access to the WIFI on the campus and in the dormitories. With your account you can also log in to the JGU apps and use the semester ticket and library card.

ACTIVATING YOUR ACCOUNT

In order to be able to use your student account, you have to activate it:

You will receive an email to your private email address with an individual link and a personal activation code.

After clicking on the link, you have to enter the activation code. Then you can create your personal password.

CERTIFICATES OF ENROLLMENT AND EXMATRICULATION



If you need a certificate of **enrollment** at JGU in order to submit it to authorities or your home university, for example, you can print it out yourself.

You can also print out your certificate of **exmatriculation**, for your time at JGU, yourself. You will need a certificate of exmatriculation in case you plan to spend another semester abroad or complete a degree in Germany. The certificate is made available mid-April (winter semester) or mid-October (summer semester).

In order to access the certificates, log into JOGU-StINe and select "Service" – "My Documents". Download your documents from the online portal and save them in order to have permanent access to them.

The Access to the online platform JOGU-StINe is limited to the duration of your enrollment and will be deleted the semester after the end of your stay

Your documents are provided only in electronic form and will **not** be sent via email.

UPDATE YOUR ADDRESS

Please use your student account to log into JOGU-StINe and update your address once you moved into Mainz.

In order to do so, click on "Service" > "Personal Details" > "Change" > "Save".

If you move later, please always remember to change your address here.

REGISTRATION AT THE "BÜRGERSERVICE" MAINZ

During your time in Germany, you have to be registered at the city's registration office ("Bürgerservice"). You have to make an appointment with the "Bürgerservice" yourself. You can find out how to do this on the next page.

If you live in another city, you have to visit the registration office there in order to register. At the end of your stay, you need to de-register again.



You must register yourself within 14 days after your arrival. If there is no appointment available within two weeks of your arrival, simply choose the next possible appointment that is free.

HOW TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT ONLINE AT THE "BÜRGERSRERVICE "

You can arrange your appointment under: otv.mainz.de/





STEP 1: Click "Bürgerservice/ Ortsverwaltungen". STEP 2: Choose "Anmeldung (Zuzug aus dem Ausland)". STEP 3: Optional download of the template "Wohnungsgeberbescheinigung". You receive this from the Studierendenwerk. You only need to download it and have your landlord fills it out if you live in a private flat.

STEP 4: Choose a day and a time slot.

STEP 5: Fill in your personal data

STEP 6: You will receive an email. Confirm the appointment by clicking the link in the email.

STEP 7: Your request will be checked and you will get a second email with the final confirmation and information.

VISA

Students who need a visa must make an appointment with the Foreigners' Registration Office in Mainz AFTER they have registered with the city of Mainz. You can make an appointment online under otv.mainz.de/ (See instructions on the left)

Please choose "Abteilung Ausländerangelegenheiten"and then "Aufenthaltserlaubnis zum Studium/Sprachkurs".

At the moment there are extremely long waiting times. Therefore, we recommend all students to apply for a visa already in their home country, even if entry without a visa would be possible.

Please read again our advice from Practical Guide 1 (Step 4 -Visa).



OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT (OPTIONAL)

You are not required to open a bank account. However, it could be useful if you hail from a non-EU country, for example. In order to open an account, you need a tax identification number. This will automatically be sent to you once you registered with the city. If you don't receive anything, you can go to your local tax office and inquire there. If you have further questions, write us an email using gis@international.uni-mainz.de.


Once you registered at the

"Bürgerservice Mainz", you are also required to register for the so called "Rundfunkbeitrag (licence fee)" which finances the public sector media.

STEP 5: Re- check your information for accuracy, if necessary, click on "Korrigieren" to correct, something. If everything is fine, click Anmeden 18,36 € each month

After submitting your online registration, you will receive a confirmation. As soon as the payment is due, you will receive a notification from the "Rundfunkbeitragservice" via regular mail/post. With this notification, you will receive information about the payment and the recipient account (IBAN and amount).

BUT I DON'T HAVE A TV!

The payment is due regardless of whether you possess a TV or a radio since all programs are also available online.

SHARED APARTMENT = SHARED FEE

If you live in a shared apartment, please check with your flat mates to see if somebody is already paying because each household only has to pay once (not per person but per apartment door). If this is the case, you can deregister at:

HOW TO RECEIVE AND USE THE STUDICARD

The StudiCard enables you to pay without cash in the Mensa and cafeterias as well as use printers and photocopiers on campus and wash machines and dryers in the dormitories.



HOW TO OBTAIN THE STUDICARD

You can get the StudiCard for 5 Euro at the:

Info-Point, (Studihaus, Staudingerweg 21, Entrance F).



The only reason you **DON'T NEED** to buy the StudiCard is if you received it as a **key** for your dormitory apartment (except Hechtsheim and Weisenau).

In order to pick it up you need to bring:

- ✓ Your student ID (App)
- ✓ A valid photo ID (passport)
- ✓ 5 Euro for issuing the card

HOW TO LOAD MONEY

Your Studicard has the function to automatically reload as soon as it runs out of money (**Autoload**).



To activate this function, you must first share your bank information with the staff of the Info-Point.

Alternatively you can also use the so called "**Kartenaufwerter**", to load money on the card. You find them in the Mensa or in any cafeteria. The machine only accepts bills (no coins!)

- PLEASE NOTE:

There are two different acounts on your StudiCard.

a) GENERAL ACCOUNT

this is the money you load on your card via the "Kartenaufwerter" (see picture above) and which you use to pay in the Mensa.

b) PRINTING ACCOUNT

this allows you to use the campus printing system. In order to load money on your printing account, you first have to make sure that you have enough money on your "general account", then to go to a service terminal e.g. in the UniversityLibrary (UB) and choose "Geld aufbuchen" (more details on page 44). **Bonus of ZDV:** You get 2.50 euros for free on your printing account!

HOW TO PRINT



You can print and scan in most of the libraries or in the ZDV (Data center) computer pool. For this you need your StudiCard (see previous page).

CHARGE PRINT ACCOUNT

STEP 1: FIND A SERVICE TERMINAL (COMPUTER)

Go to a service terminal, e.g. in the University Library (UB) More locations: www.en-zdv.unimainz.de/service-terminallocations/ The service terminal's screen will look like this:



STEP 2: ASSIGNING YOUR STUDI-CARD

- Click on "Karte zuordnen"
- Log in with your student account (you received the login data duringthe matriculation).
- Change your PIN (only numbers, at least 4)

STEP 3: LOAD MONEY ON YOUR STUDICARD PRINTING ACCOUNT

First you have to check if you have enough money on your card's general account. If you do, follow the next steps:

- Click "Druckguthaben aufbuchen" on the service terminal screen
- Hold your card to the black/blue –scanner
- Enter your PIN
- Hold your card to the other scanner(light blue/grey)
- Follow step 1-4:



PRINTING

- Send your print jobs to the printer \\jgu-ps-1.zdv.net\Drucken or uploadthem online under drucken.zdv.net/app
- Put your Studicard on the card-reader at the side of the printer
- Enter your PIN, choose your print job



FINDING LITERATURE IN LIBRARIES AND ONLINE CATALOGUE



You will find a wide variety of libraries on campus.

Except for libraries from the Medicine and Psychology departments, all other departments are represented on the campus.

In the online catalogue ("Rechercheportal") you can check out where to find certain books and browse through the huge digital catalogue of literature: hds.hebis.de/ubmz/index.php

In most of the libraries, you can also find computer rooms where you have the opportunity to scan and print out literature.

HOW TO OBTAIN A LIBRARY CARD

If you want to borrow books, you will need a library ID. You can apply for this online and use it with the JGU app.

BORROWING AND RETURNING BOOKS

Please note: In most libraries, taking books home for long periods of time is not permitted. Most likely you may only borrow them overnight or for a weekend. Exeption: University Library - There, you can borrow books for up to 4 weeks. In order to borrow books there, use the book scanners at the entrance of the "Lehrbuchsammlung". You put your library card in the slot and enter your library card PIN (your date of birth in the format dd/mm/yy) or use the JGU-app.





IN CASE OF EMERGENCY...

The most important number for you is 112. You only need to dial this number (free of charge) in order to reach the emergency services – police, medical services or fire brigade – anywhere in Germany and Europe immediately.




